Teachers' Notes

Primary pupils may need to clarify just what a bully is, before discussion of protecting themselves on the internet and on mobile phones. If they fill in these pictures/words, (see page 2) you will have a sense of how grounded their understanding remains, where there is confusion or ignorance. Then lead the discussion to answer questions like these.

Do people ever tell lies on the internet?

Is keeping secrets ever a good idea?

Can you tell a bully by looking at him/her?

Where can you get help if you are scared or confused?

What can you do if someone is using your mobile number or a page on the internet to threaten you or to say mean things?
